Robert Young representing the residents of Bridge Road disturbed by the Champlain Flyers Clubs noise. The flyers Club representative stated that the club normally flys from 9:00 A.M. until Dark.

The Decibel rating is 85 DB

Question on what Mr. Young would like from the town. Mr. Young would like to see the Town adopt a noise ordinance. Board suggests the Flyer Club and the Residents enter into mediation as this is a private matter.

C. Worth made the motion for Resolution awarding bid for the water well drilling to N.A. Manosh, Inc. with the funds thereof to come from the monies awarded by NYS EFC DWSRF Program (#18184) and further authorizing the Town Board to Execute a contract with Manosh for well drilling services. C. Barrows second. All aye. Motion carried.

C. Barrows made the motion for Resolution approving the proposal for the Hydrogeological Services to be performed by Hydrosource Associates ("Hydrosource") with the Funds thereof to come from monies awarded by the NYS EFC DWSRF Program (#18184) and further authorizing the Town Board to execute a contract with Hydrosource for water well hydrogeological Services. C. Peters second. All aye. Motion carried.

Discussion on snow removal equipment 3 quotes were received. Two skid steers and 1 tractor for snow removal from sidewalks.

C. Worth made the motion to purchase snow removal equipment. C. Macey second. All aye. Motion carried.

C. Macey made the motion to purchase the John Deere tractor for the snow removal with a snow blower, broom and sander. C. Worth second. All aye. Motion carried.

C. Worth made the motion to adopt the Preliminary Budget to become the 2019 Budget as presented. C. Peters second. All aye. Motion carried.

The lighting at the Town Shed is being worked on.

Question on water drain pipe near the firehouse the inflow pipe is smaller than the out flow. The Town is working with AES and AES is working with Reale Construction. They are reviewing the catch basin, drain by the firehouse, and drive at 2772 Main Street.

Work at the well site is being worked on diligently. There was a meeting yesterday we will need a 200 ft. surrounding the area to protect our aquifer.
