State Police Satellite Station

The former restaurant would be sold to the Town for a purchase price of \$70,000.00 then the Town would turn the building over to the NYS Police. Question is it worth the sale to Town and let NYS Police do the renovations? The Town Budget would have to be modified . Also some modifications would have to be done to the interior. A garage would have to be constructed, originally landowner had said he would build a garage. We would have to have a contract with minimum number of years they would occupy the building. This would be a must have. The officer that has been in communication with S. Harrington is on vacation until July,13,2021. Any negotiations would include the whole Board. A draft agreement of sale with the seller after which the Town would have to have an appraisal done of the property. In order to purchase property a resolution from the NYS Police would have to be willing to stay 20 years.

The monies the Town is receiving from ROOST in the amount of \$20,000.00 has to be used by a regional organization. Discussion had been mentioned of a skating rink, also holding movies in the Veterans Park the cost for a screen, projector and speakers estimate cost of \$2500.00. Suggested another agency provide refreshments. C. Peters will move forward with project. Also suggested the Gazebo is in need of renovation possible could be an Eagle Scout Project. Also need is the purchase of 2 dog waste stations.

Comments from the floor

Zoning Committee would like the Board to appoint Loyd Lamotte to the committee he has shown interested in being appointed. C. Peters made the motion to appoint Loyd Lamottee to the Zoning Committee. C. Wayman second. All aye. Motion carried.

The Committee is into the first 27 pages into proposal the total pages will be approximately 60 pages. In the later part of the fall regulations should be ready to present to the Town Board. This only applies to the Hamlet. Members of the Zoning Committee are Clayton Menser, Wally Ross, Will Gunnison, Theresa Miclette, and Loyd Lamotte. The proposal will presented to the APA to review before presenting to the Town Board.

Question on the mobile home located at 731 Creek Road. Code Enforcement Officer has put a halt on the project. No permits have been issued. Thank you to S. Harrington and C. Worth.

Kathleen Wood question on noise ordinance concerning dogs parking and loud music on Main Street. Town Attorney Tom Peterson will provide a noise ordinance for the hamlet.

We have had no complaints on the Airplane's on Lake Road there can be 5 campers on the property. It is no longer zoned Agriculture.

Denise Huestis provided the Town Board about a recent incident that took place in the Hammond Library between Ms. Huestis and Wendy Terbeek the Librarian. Supervisor Harrington will address the situation.
